
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Q1. If it became an option for our industry, would you want to open your business for contactless delivery and pick-up, at Alert Level 4 (if we move back to this level at any time in the future)?

Would probably need some form of subsidy, wages or vouchers/ help financially if it we are in lockdown for a long period.

Under restrictions it is not viable unless the wage subsidy is in place.

Yes would need to keep operating if no wage subsidy as would want to try and pay staff.

If we had another wage subsidy we might consider it, however we do not believe our takings through contactless delivery and pick up would provide nearly enough cash to sustain the overheads or our large site during that time (Level 4).
